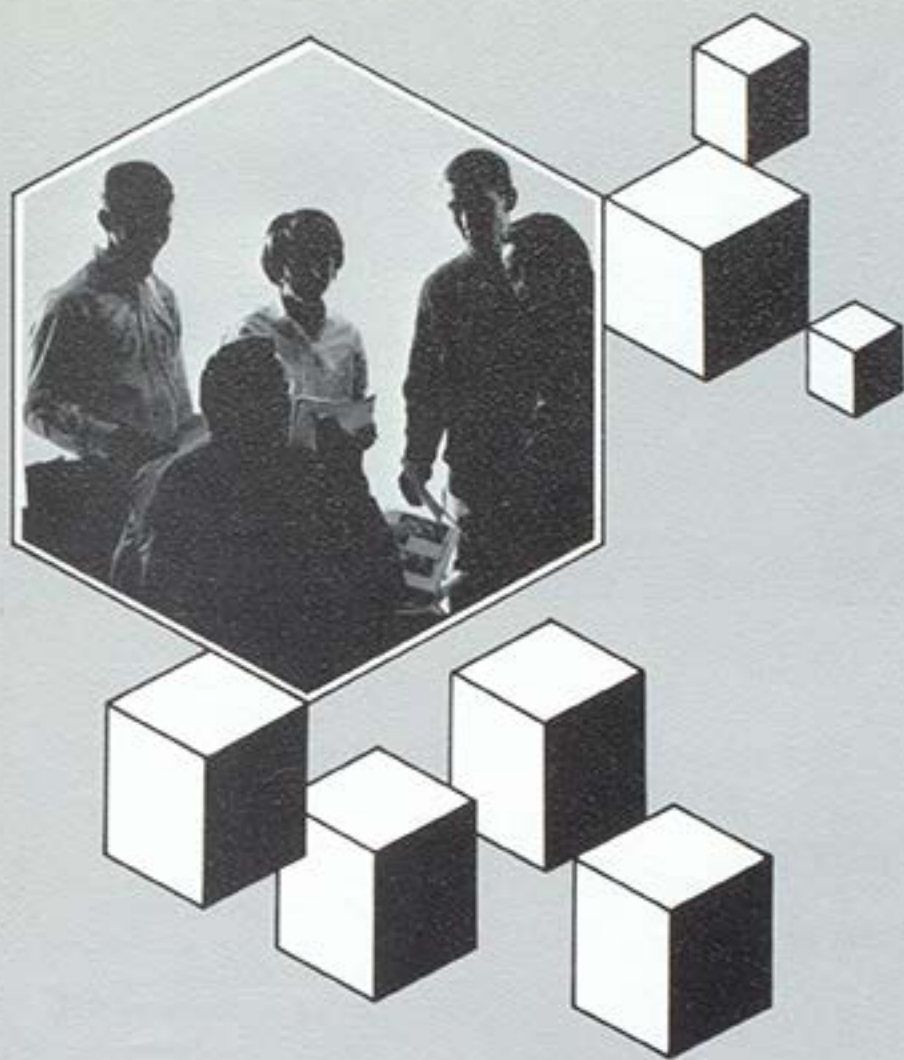




Ghost Writer

The Blue Devils enjoyed a highly successful season this year. The team smashed non-conference foes 10-1, their only loss coming at the hands of the Cumberland Pirates. 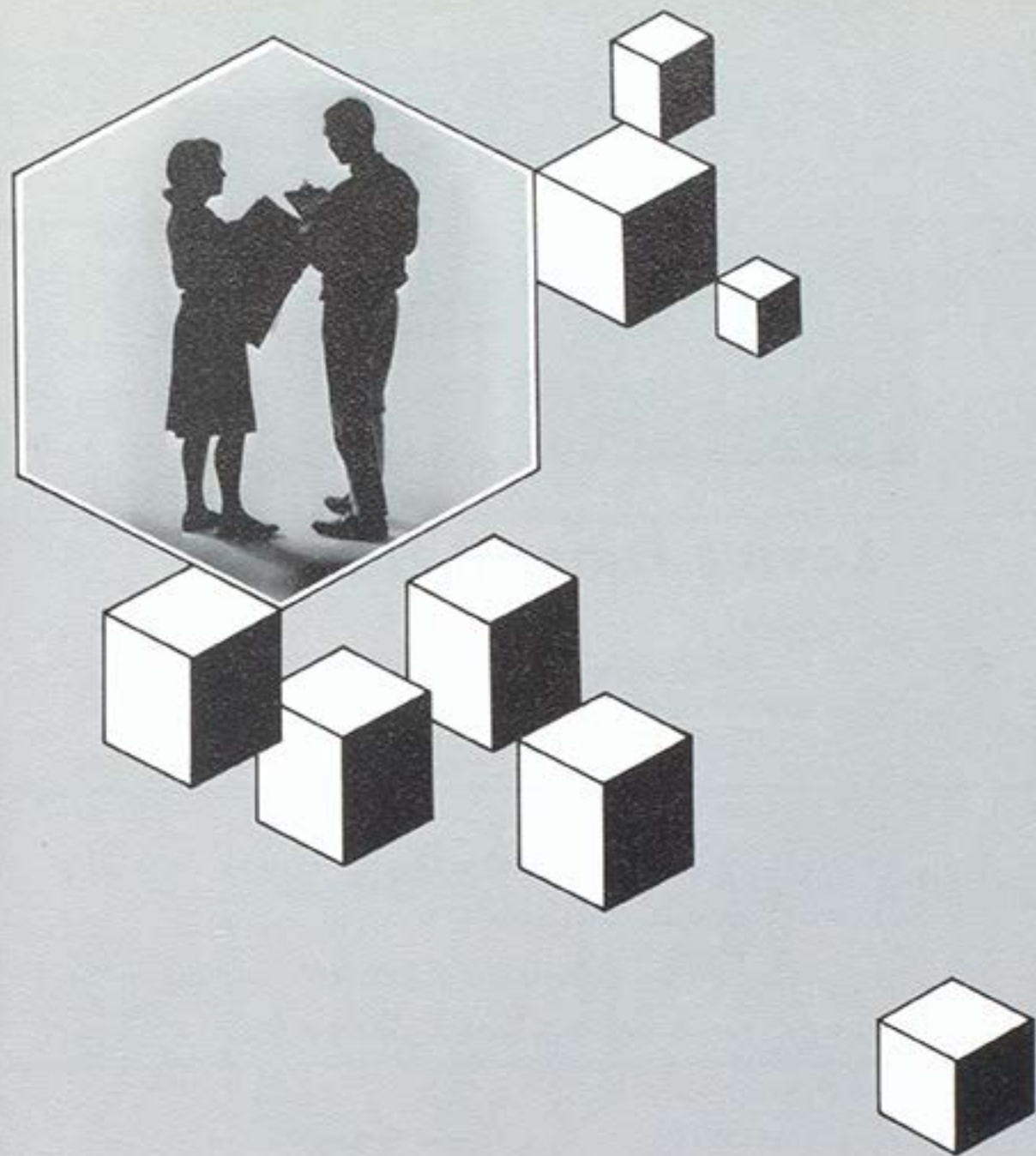

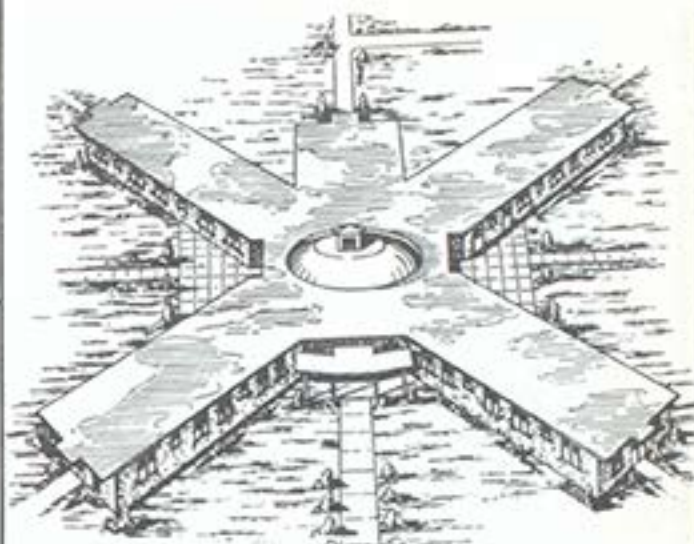
