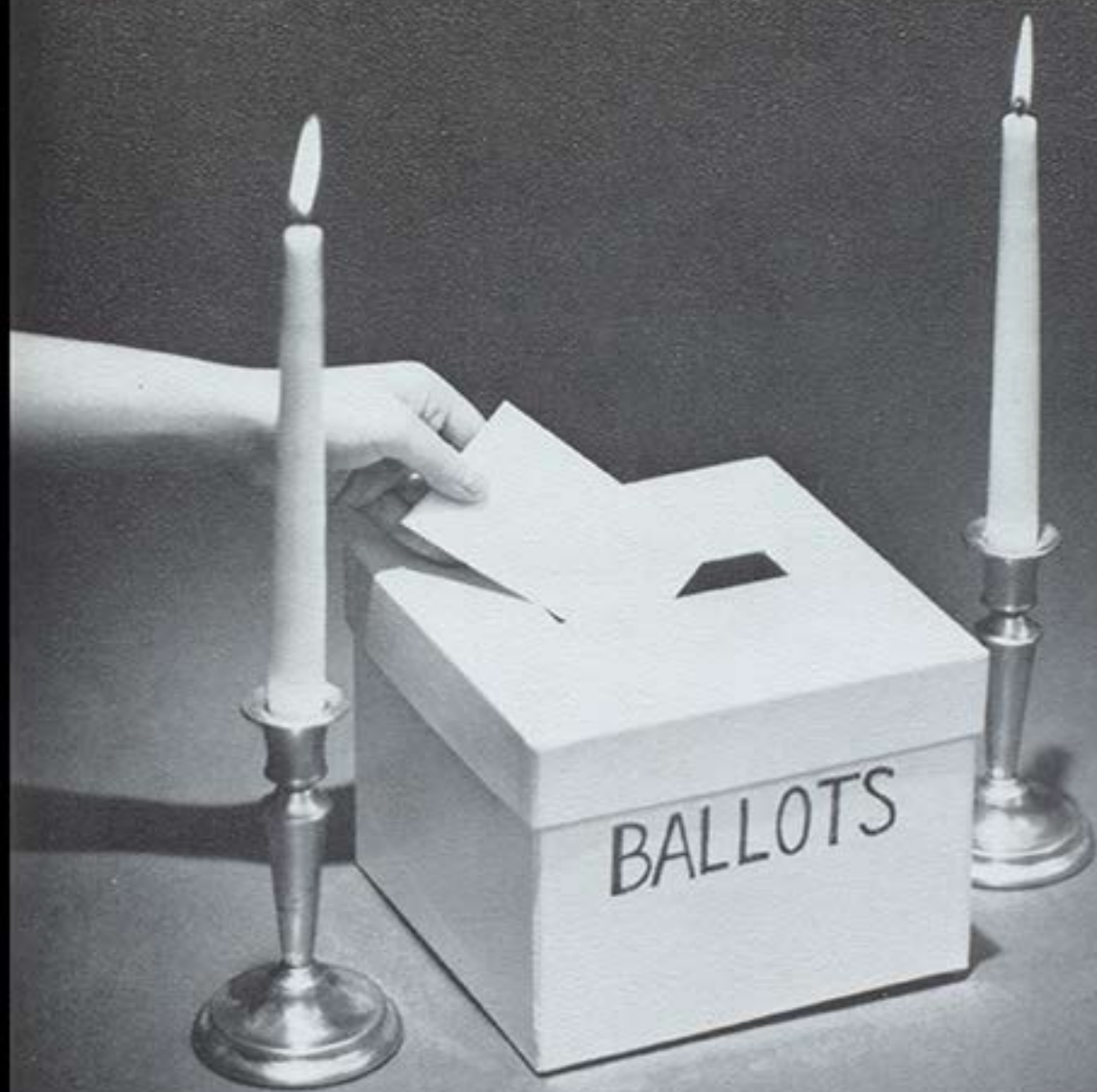
Earns Many Laughs


The roads to success through high school are memorable ones. We hope that through this book we have portrayed a span of these roads upon which each of us travels.

With all these things in mind, we present to you this 1966 POW-WOW.

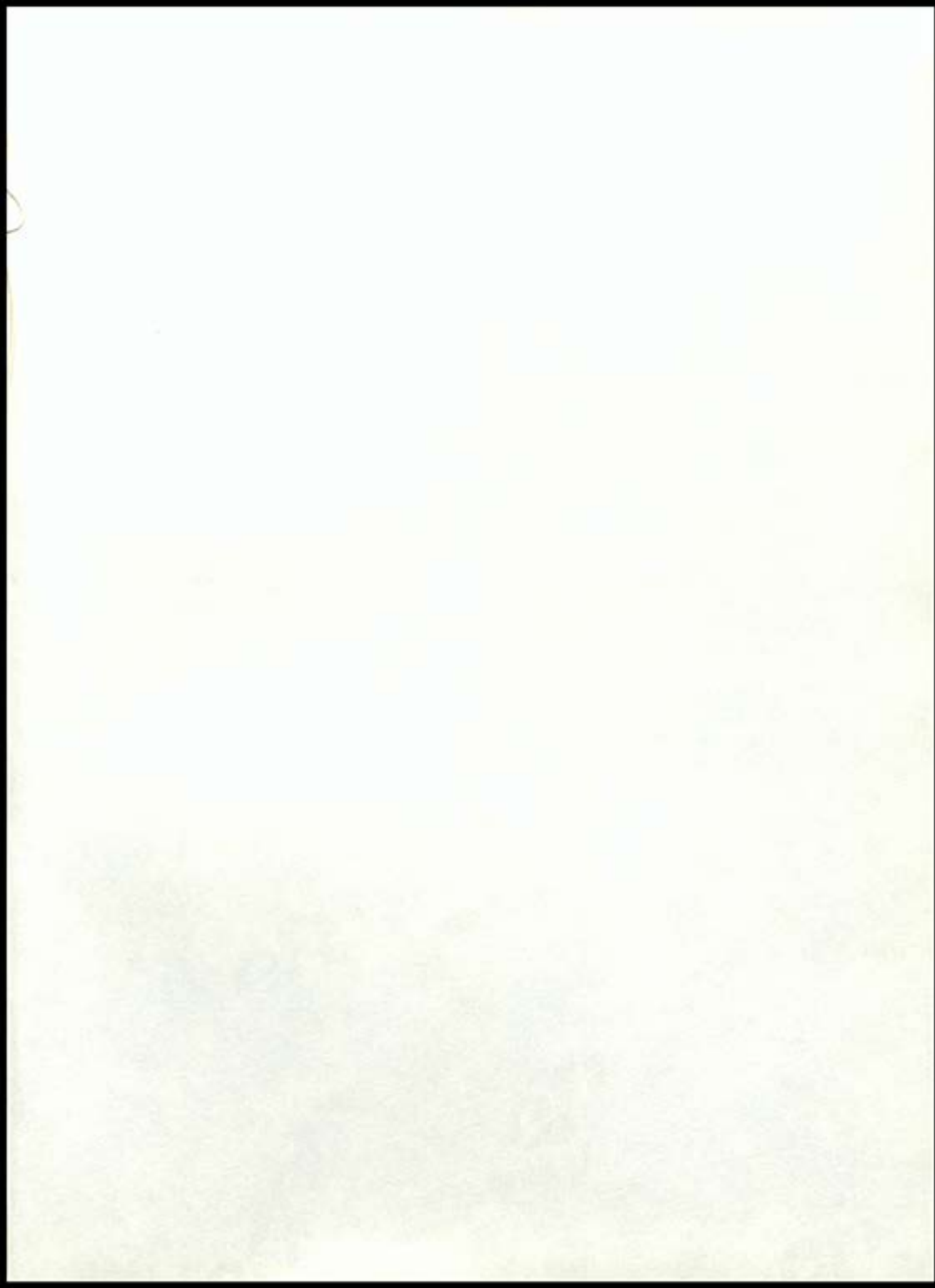


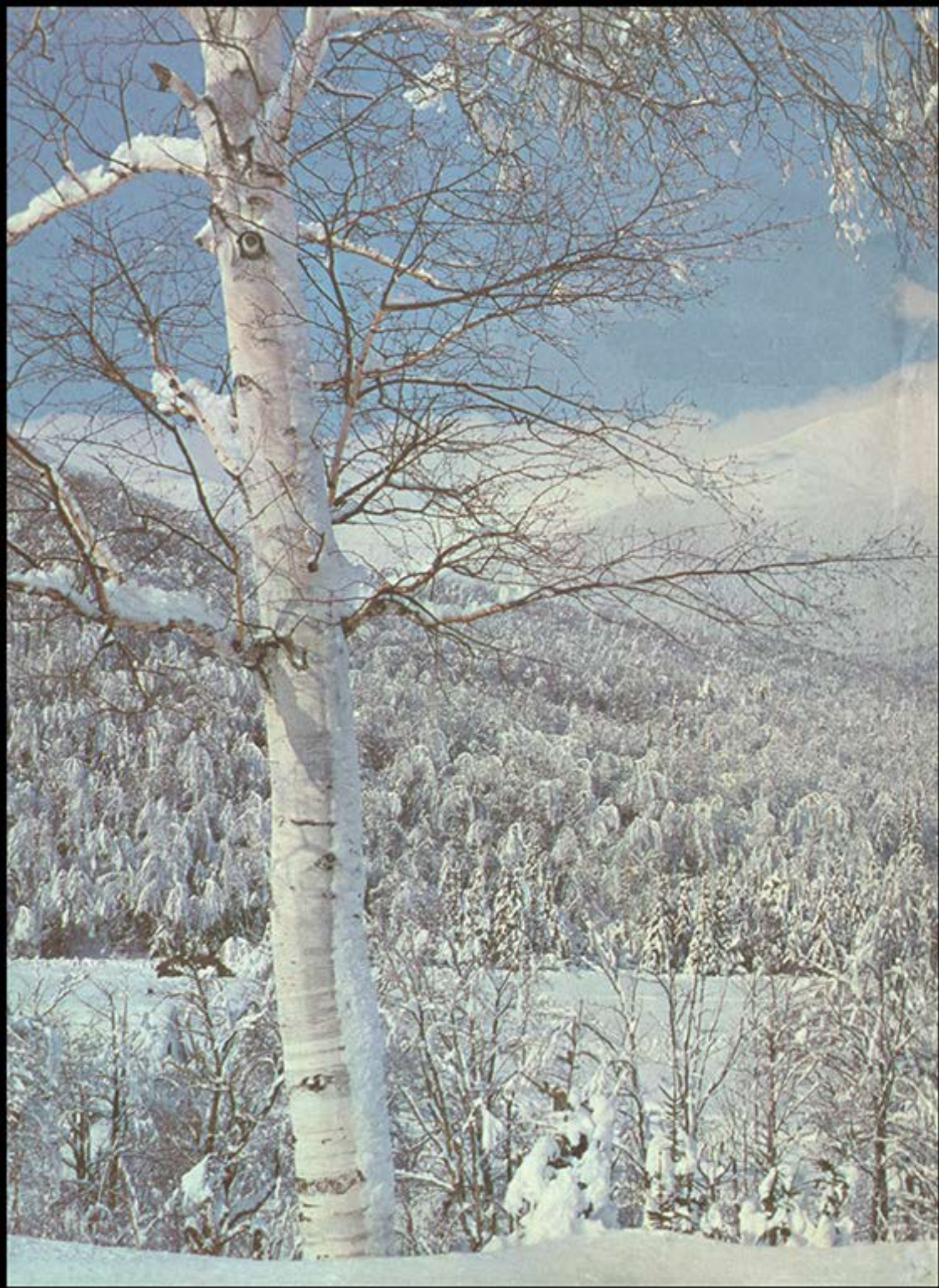
