We, the Pow Wow Staff of 1983, dedicate our yearbook to Peggy Bullerman.





A common error in writing narratives is to stray from the main idea of your story. If you are telling about how you hooked your thumb while fishing, avoid

giving details about the weather or how large a fish someone else caught. These things have nothing to do with your story. One way of deciding whether a detail is necessary is to consult your story plan. If a detail will help to build on some in the plan (time, place, size, job, action, behavior), that detail is likely to be useful and appropriate. If the detail does not apply to any part in the plan, omit it.

EXERCISE 6. The following narrative contains a non-essential detail. Decide which details should be omitted, and state their job in a list on your notebook.
